The most recent report from TN Department of Tourist Development showed a tax savings per household of \$197.00.

Just a few events to mention that are already being planned are Hamburger Day on the Hill, we will be increasing business and tourism workshops, and expanding Don't Be Fooled by adding more senior service providers.
